

She completed her Post-Doctoral Fellowship in the Developmental Disabilities Services department at The Children's Center in Detroit, MI, specializing in Autism assessment and differential diagnosis of developmental disorders. She has conducted a wealth of psychological evaluations to identify commonly occurring disorders including depression, anxiety, ADHD, learning disabilities, and post-traumatic stress disorder.

Dr. Marilyn is an Assistant Clinical Professor in the Wayne State University Psychology Department where she teaches graduate level courses in assessment and supervision. She also directs clinical training and provides clinical supervision for the Children's Hospital of Michigan General Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine Clinic's Integrated Behavioral Health Team.
